1. (U) NAME AND TYPE OF OPERATION: Operation Saratoga, a 25th Infantry Division offensive operation in its Tactical Area of Interest (TAOI).

7. (C) SUPPORTING FORCES:

a. Artillery: Artillery support for 3-22 Infantry during Operation Saratoga was provided by 1-8th Artillery. At various times during the operation the following batteries provided direct support for the battalion:

(1) A Battery, 1-8th Artillery (105mm)

- (2) C Battery, 1-8th Artillery (105mm)
- (3) C Battery, 2-77th Artillery (105mm)
- (4) B Battery, 3-13th Artillery (155mm)

(5) Additional fire support was provided by the Battalion Heavy Weapons Platoon in general support, while all weapons platoons provided direct support at company level. All supporting artillery fires were extremely accurate.

b. United States Air Force: Extensive effective use was made of Tactical Air to include preplanned and immediate missions. All 3-22 Infantry requests for air support went through 2d Brigade, 25th Infantry Division, this was accomplished by forwarding all requests to the 2d Brigade Liaison Officer.

c. Army Aviation: Extensive use was made of Army Aviation during Operation Saratoga. Army Aviation units that worked for 3-22 Infantry were as follows:

8. (C) INTELLIGENCE:

a. Intelligence concerning the battalion TAOB for Operation Saratoga was obtained from 25th Infantry Division G-2, 2d Brigade S-2, 25th MI Detachment and VR sightings.

b. Enemy initiated incidents during Operation Saratoga were as follows:

- (1) Sniper Fire: 24
- (2) Mortar Fire: 4
- (3) Mines: 0
- (4) Booby Traps: 1
- (5) Engagements: 37
- (6) Fire Against Aircraft: 4

c. At 2045 hours on 29 January 68, D 26 sprung an ambush on 4 VC at XT744155. The VC body count was unknown at that time. At 2210 hours on the same night, D 26 spotted a VC battalion estimated 300-400 strong moving from north to south along the road (XT744155). They were carrying numerous recoilless rifles and 82mm mortar tubes plus small arms. D 26 requested artillery and adjusted the fire. The VC element was dispersed. It could be assumed that this unit was moving south to take part in the TET offensive which was planned to start shortly after that. A sweep of the area the following day disclosed 1 VC (BC).

d. On 31 Jan 68, the battalion was moved into Cu Chi Base Camp. Intelligence reports indicated that all major US installations would be hit at 0300 (US C-3). Cu Chi came under mortar attack at 0300 hours, however damage was not extensive and there was no ground attack.

e. During the first few days of Feb 68, intelligence reports indicated the presence of large numbers of VC in the area south and east of Cu Chi. There were also reports of the VC capturing villagers and using them for slave labor. From these intelligence reports and from the actions of the enemy it was assumed that his objective was to try and stop convoy movement on MSR 1. The biggest VC resistance was in the village of AP Cho (XT699090) where the enemy were in bunkers made of concrete and reinforced with railroad ties. These bunkers were also connected by a trench and tunnel complex. Fighting in the village was characterized by the enemy staying in position and fighting, contrary to encounters fought in the past.

f. During the last few weeks in Operation Saratoga, the battalion was located north of the Saigon region. Here the operation was characterized by lighter enemy contact, none of the type encountered in AP Cho. Numerous bunker complexes were found containing anywhere from 10 to 100 bunkers. Also numerous caches of the new 122mm rocket and its component parts were uncovered. It is believed that these rockets were being used on the Tan Son Nhut Airfield during and after the TET offensive. The enemy also utilized sampans very frequently as a mode of transportation.

9. (C) MISSION: 3-22 Infantry (-) convoyed from Dau Tieng Base Camp to FSB SCARLET, via MSR 2, to conduct reconnaissance in force operations to locate, fix and destroy VC/NVA forces between Cu Chi and Saigon.

10. (C) CONCEPT OF OPERATION: The 3-22 Infantry (-) to move and secure FSB SCARLET. Initiate action with reconnaissance in force (RIF) to locate, fix and destroy VC/NVA forces along the MSR. The Battalion, Company, and Platoon size units will be prepared to; reinforce other units under attack, provide security for designated areas and routes.

11. (C) EXECUTION:

Chronological Summary:

a. 26 Jan - 3-22 Infantry (-) is OPCON to 2d Brigade, and is securing FSB SCARLET (XT728145) and RIF in assigned AO. Negative contact as of 2400 hours.

b. 27 Jan - Company D vicinity XT755150 was receiving S/A fire. At 1019 hours Company D withdrew and called in artillery with negative results or casualties. At 1120 hours Company D (XT751154) found 5 bunkers 5x6x4 with 2' OHC, one booby trapped grenade was destroyed. At 1220 hours Company D was cloverleafing at XT759154 and found 12 bunkers 4x6x4 with 2' OHC, 3 tunnels approximately 10 meters long and 3 fresh graves. At 1225 hours Company A was maneuvering against a VC force, with Company C to Company A's rear, and Stinger LFT was on station for support. At 1230 hours Company A had lost contact. At 1315 hours Company D dug up three graves and received credit for 3 VC (BC). At 1400 hours Company A had 3 VC (BC). At 1420 hours Company D XT759149 found 3 bunkers 4x6x4 with 2' OHC, 250 meters of trench. At 1428 hours Company A at XT751158 received credit for 2 more VC KIA (BC) as a result of Stinger LFT. At 1507 hours Company D found three tunnels 10 meters long with sleeping quarters, 1 trench 50 meters long and 1 protective mask all at XT758149. At 1520 hours Company D at XT758149 found 20 punji pits 4x4x4. At 1530 hours Company C at XT752-158 found 2 bunkers 8x10x4 with 2' OHC. At 1608 hours GLadiator LFT spotted several VC and engaged at XT750162. At 1625 hours Company C reported 5 VC (BC). At 1630 hours Diamondhead LFT reported sinking one sampan at XT751163. At 1640 hours Company C at XT750163 reported that they were overrunning a bunker resulting in one VC (BC). At 1655 hours Companies A and C lost contact. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

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c. 28 Jan - At 1340 hours Company C reported finding 1 VC hand, at XT747147 and were given credit for 1 VC (BC). At 1400 hours Company B vicinity XT747165 found 2 bunkers 6x3x4, 1 bunker 3x5x4 with 2' OHC. At 1510 hours Company D found 1 bunker 6x10x5 with 2' OHC. All bunkers destroyed. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

d. 29 Jan - At 1150 hours Company C reported heavy contact at XT752163, size of force unknown. At 1430 hours Company C reported 6 VC KIA (BC). At 1645 hours Company A received sniper fire at XT752162, returned fire resulting in 5 VC KIA (BC). Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

e. 30 Jan - Negative contact as of 2400 hours.

f. 31 Jan - At 1715 hours Company B reported heavy contact at XT700095 with 1 VC (BC). At 1735 hours Company A reported contact vicinity XT701095 resulting in 2 VC (BC). At 1800 hours Company A reported 7 VC (BC). Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

g. 1 Feb - At 0703 hours Companies A and B receiving sniper fire at main gate of Cu Chi. At 0725 hours Company D received fire vicinity XT625120. At 0740 hours Company D in contact at ARVN outpost at XT621131. At 0755 hours Company A receiving harassing fire at XT638132. At 0850 Companies A and B receiving fire from front and rear at XT639133. At 0900 hours Company D in contact at XT649136. At 0915 hours Company C received fire at XT627130 resulting in 1 VC (BC). At 0935 hours Company B has 2 VC (BC). At 0945 hours Company D has 3 VC (BC) at XT627126. At 1210 hours Company D reports 2 VC (BC) and 5 weapons at XT621126. At 1215 hours Company A captured 1 POE WIA. At 1430 hours Company D again in contact at XT629119.

h. 2 Feb - Company D, securing ARVN outpost XT621131, receiving S/A and 60mm mortar at 0250 hours. At 0705 hours Cu Chi Base Camp under 122mm rocket attack. Mohawk ASP burned, resulting in ammo explosions. Negative contact as of 2400 hours.

i. 3 Feb - 0900 hours Company D received sniper fire. At 0915 hours Company D reported heavy contact. At 1015 hours Company D was still in contact and required an air strike. At 1050 hours Company A 4/23 Infantry (M) became OPCOM to Company A 3-22 Infantry both elements made contact at XT695092. At 1202 hours Issue 24 completed air strike, 1 VC (BC), D6 reported 5 VC (BC). At 1310 hours Company D reported contact lost and was entering village at XT700099. At 1325 hours Company D reported renewed contact at XT687145. Company D reports 4 more VC (BC) for a total of 10. At 1420 hours Company A reported more contact at XT695092. At 1425 hours Company C moved down MSR 1 to assist Company A in contact. At 1525 hours Company D completely extracted, total VC (BC) 14. At 1620 hours Company C has renewed contact at XT688094. At 1730 hours Company C lost contact, total VC (BC) 7. At 1815 hours all companies were receiving fire at XT697-091. At 1940 hours Company C took 1 VC POW in a spider hole vicinity XT-626100. At 2000 hours Companies A and C were give mission to recover three trucks that were broken down at XT663104. At 2010 hours at XT663104, while securing vehicles Companies A and C received AK-47 fire, contact lost at 2045. At 2200 hours Company A closed ARVN compound at Cu Chi City, Company C closed Cu Chi Base Camp. Total VC (BC) for the day 21.

j. 4 Feb - 3-22 Infantry (-) conducted RIF in Cu Chi City. Negative contact as of 2400 hours.

k. 5 Feb - At 0926 hours Company B had 3 detainees at XT641132. Detainees had US ID card, Dog Tags and EM/PAC manual. Negative contact as of 2400 hours.

l. 6 Feb - At 0915 hours while clearing the road vicinity XT-675100 Company A received fire from north and south. At 1035 hours Company D met with Company C and began sweeping southwest on highway # 1. At 1325

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hours Company D made contact at XT697091. At 1730 hours 3-22 Infantry (-) was given the mission to attack and take the area of contact, XT697091, Companies A and C will lead with Company D in reserve. At 1855 hours Companies A and C were in contact with VC in bunkers with M4G and AK-47. At 2040 hours Company C had taken 1 bunker. At 2050 Company B received mortar and RPG fire while in position in the ARVN outpost. At 2015 hours Companies A and C extracted to Cu Chi. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

m. 7 Feb - At 1005 hours vicinity XT701088 Company C received fire. At 1100 hours Company C 1st contact. At 1245 hours Company A spotted 5 VC in green uniforms at XT700090, fired on them with S/A and M-79. At 1442 hours Company A was receiving S/A and RPG fire, both units pulled back to allow artillery to fire on contact area. At 1540 hours Company C reported 1 detainee. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

n. 8 Feb - At 0920 hours after 2 air strikes Companies B and D moved into objective area and made contact at XT703087. At 1100 hours a third air strike was made, by 1415 hours the 4th and 5th air strikes were complete. At 1725 hours Company D reported bunkers were heavily reinforced. At 1735 hours Company B while extracting received A/W fire from their rear. At 1810 hours contact was lost, at 1822 hours contact was re-established to be lost again at 1930 hours. POW reported a mass grave containing 30 VC bodies that was credited to 3-22 Infantry. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

o. 9 Feb - At 1130 hours Company D saw and took under fire 5 VC vicinity XT705085. At 1210 hours the air strikes were completed in the area of contact. At 1340 hours Company A received fire at XT701088 and returned fire with LAWs and 90mm RR. At 1455 hours contact was broken by VC. At 1505 hours Companies A and D advanced to a trench line and were receiving renewed sniper fire at XT700090. Company A engaged 2 VC at 1700 hours with M-60 resulting in 2 VC (BC) at XT700090. At 1730 hours Company A was heavily engaged by A/W at XT700090 resulting in 4 VC (BC). 1820 hours Company A and D receiving A/W and S/L. 1850 hours contact was broken by the VC. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

p. 10 Feb - at 0855 hours Company C was receiving sniper fire. At 1020 hours Company C had renewed sniper fire activity at XT701089. At 1030 hours contact was lost. At 1225 hours Company C was receiving heavy fire from XT700089. At 1530 hours Companies A and C extracted and called artillery on the area of contact with negative results. At 1700 hours Company A became OPCON to 4-23 Infantry (M). At 2130 hours Company D reported S/A fire and returned fire with negative results. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

q. 11 Feb - 0600 hours Dau Tieng Base Camp was receiving incoming mortar rounds. At 1458 hours Company D received carbine fire. At 1625 hours Company D received incoming AK-47 and RPG fire from XT700090. At 1720 hours Company D received 4 60mm mortar rounds. 1740 hours Company D had withdrawn and called in artillery with negative results. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

r. 12 Feb - 0900 hours Company D received 1 RPG round vicinity XT701088. At 1355 hours Company B received AK-47, A/W and RPG fire from an estimated 15 VC bunkers at XT678099. At 1510 hours Company B reported 3 VC (BC). At 1608 hours Company B was supported by CS gas from helicopters. By 1800 hours Company B eliminated the resistance and swept through the area. At 1845 hours Company D received heavy sniper fire vicinity XT679099. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

s. 13 Feb - 0910 hours Company D receiving S/A and RPG fire at XT701089. At 1145 hours Company D had withdrawn and called in artillery. At 1230 hours the first of three air strikes were put into the area of contact. 1350 hours the final air strike was put into the area of contact. At 1900 hours 3-22 Infantry (-) moved to a new night laager at XT685087. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

t. 14 Feb - Company C received 1 incoming RPG at 1055 hours vicinity XT699088. The NL came under heavy sniper fire at 1115 hours. At 1435 hours Company C reported 1 VC (BC). At 1550 hours Company C engaged 6 VC resulting in 6 VC (BC). At 1605 hours Company C was in contact with an estimated 15 VC in bunkers, by 1625 hours Company C had 3 VC (BC). At 1750 hours Company D swept the area around the NL and found 1 VC (BC).

u. 15 Feb - 1/3-4 Cavalry and C/4-23 Infantry (M) became OPCON to 3-22 Infantry as of 0600 hours. At 1000 hours Heavy Weapons fired 120 rounds of CS gas in support of attacking elements. At 1118 hours Company C, vicinity XT701088, recovered weapons lost in contact on the 11th thru 14th of February. At 1223 hours Company B reported 7 VC (BC) at XT700088, VC wore in green uniforms. At 1223 hours Company B reported 2 VC (BC) at XT703089. At 1445 hours Company B reported 8 VC (BC) in green uniforms. At 1645 hours Company B had 1 VC (BC) in green uniform. At 2125 hours Company D LP had 3 VC (BC). Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

v. 16 Feb - 1105 hours at XT701089 Company C found bunker system containing 100 bunkers 4x4x5 with 21 VC (BC). At 1230 hours Company D found 17 bunkers 4x4x5 at XT681097. At 1450 hours Company C reported an additional 4 VC (BC). Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

w. 17 Feb - 0630 hours attachments from 3-4 Cavalry and 4-23 Infantry (M) were released. 0900 hours Recon found 10 VC KIA by artillery vicinity XT700090. 3-22 Infantry (-) departed at 0940 hours and conveyed to FSB SCARLET XT728144. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

x. 18 Feb - 0145 hours NL had 15 incoming 82mm mortar rounds. At 1100 hours 3-22 Infantry (-) was given the mission to check possible rocket site vicinity XT762142. At 1425 hours Company D checked rocket site with negative findings. Negative further contact as of 2400 hours.

y. 19 Feb - 0805 hours Company B received sniper fire vicinity XT720157. At 0820 hours Company B in heavy contact at the same area. At 1045 hours Company B extracted from area of contact aided by Snokey Bear and Diamondhead LFTs. At 1240 hours 3-22 Infantry (-) was alerted for a new mission in new AO. At 1500 hours resupply convoy, vicinity XT704144, received A/W and RPG fire. At 1705 hours 3-22 Infantry (-) made a combat air assault into LZ, XT840025.
